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#### Gooderham Items on eBay

Earlier this year, a miniature button by Canadian artist John Gooderham was sold on eBay by a seller in Florida for \$152.52 US. 25 bids were made for the 5/8" button with a bent brass wire shank. The design is a double overlay, beige to white, with a top window and five side windows separated by "slit" cuts. The canes are Murano which John frequently used and a red "J" signature cane is visible on the bottom.



Another Gooderham pin, just at or over 3/8", triangular in shape, with a swirled rose design and a "J" signature on the back, sold on eBay on March 4<sup>th</sup> after 8 bids for the price of \$194.50 US.

## **High Price Antique English Paperweight – Islington**

This may be the highest selling price we have seen on eBay in recent years. An antique Islington weight with multiple silhouette canes, a close-packed millefiori, sold on March 27<sup>th</sup>, 2010 for \$10,778.90 USD. Below is a photo of the weight from the eBay site.



## Fire Destroys Lundberg Studios Showroom in Davenport, California

Part of the well-known Lundberg Studios art glass operation was destroyed by fire. The studio's main showroom, a small shingled house adjacent to the glassmaking studio, office and a smaller retail showroom was engulfed in flames. The cause is under investigation. Damage to the structure is estimated at \$300,000.

Lundberg Studios began in the backyard shop of James Lundberg in 1970. Lundberg died in 1992. His wife, Rebecca, owns the business. She estimated about 40 percent of their inventory was destroyed. She said they still employ the same team of four glassblowers. "It's heartbreaking; we had a few thousand pieces at the very least; hundreds and hundreds of lamp shades, lamps, crystal, paperweights, vases; I have to figure it out," she said. "We had glass everywhere. Fortunately, no one was hurt, and the firefighters were phenomenal."

Lundberg said they will be open for business by the following weekend, either in a smaller showroom or in the office. "This put a big chink in our operation, but we're going to get up and running for sure," Lundberg said.

#### Site Selection for PCA Convention, May 18-21, 2011

Washington D.C. has been selected for next year's paperweight convention. The Smithsonian Institution will provide the opportunity to view its fine paperweight collection which has been unavailable for public viewing since the 1970's.

The convention will be held at the Hilton-McLean in Tysons Corner, VA. All activities will take place at the hotel, except on Friday, when the group will leave en masse for the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History. Buses will be provided to shuttle PCA members between the venues. In preparation for the event, a complete catalogue was made of the weights by Alan and Susan Kaplan, and each of the pieces was photographed by John Hawley, *PCA Bulletin* Editor. The Kaplan catalogue and Hawley photographs will be given to the Smithsonian to form part of their archive.

The Smithsonian is a complex of nineteen museums, nine research centers and the National Zoo. The Museums include the American Art Museum and National Portrait Gallery, the National Air and Space Museum, the Smithsonian Castle (information center), the National Postal Museum and the Museum of American History.

The Hilton-McLean is accepting reservations at the convention rate of \$158 per night, available three nights before and three nights after the convention dates to allow collectors an extended visit to the Washington D.C. area. A sightseeing tour is being planned for Wednesday, so plan to arrive early to take advantage of this great opportunity to see this spectacular city. The newly remodeled hotel, with its excellent facilities, is closer to Dulles International Airport than Reagan Washington International Airport. Area attractions can be easily accessed via the Metro public transportation system.

## L.H. Selman Paperweight Weekend Held in Chicago, October 1-3, 2010

The first paperweight weekend sponsored by the new owners of L.H. Selman was a weekend filled with paperweight activities. Approximately 70 people attended, including Larry and Marti Selman. There was a large group from the Texas chapter, and Tracy & Rick Willson made up the international portion of attendees.

Artists Rick & Melissa Ayotte, Ken Rosenfeld and David Graeber presented new work. Guests were invited to view the paperweights available in the October online auction and to view a few thousand other weights on display and in the backroom drawers of the Selman Gallery. What an

experience to see so many beautiful weights in hand! Also on display was Ben Clark's large-scale photographic exhibit of paperweights taken in colour and minute detail.

On Saturday, we were given a tour by Larry Selman of the Rubloff Paperweight Collection in the Chicago Art Institute across the street.



A private lunch was given at the Cliff Dwellers Club across the street which afforded a beautiful view of the city and lake. Later, there was more gallery time with artists, auction and a book signing by Texas paperweight collector Art Elder. Proceeds from the sale of his book, "The Art of Collecting" are to be donated to the Jokelson Scholarship Fund.



The evening ended with dinner atop the Fine Arts Building where the Selman Gallery is located. There was entertainment, plenty of door prizes and a "Paperweight Jeopardy" game to test our knowledge. Wes Clark, the new President of the Illinois PCA Chapter and father of Ben and Mitch Clark, the new owners of L.H. Selman, Ltd., played the role of Alex Trebek. Larry and Marti Selman created the contest with volunteer contestants battling through to Final Jeopardy. The winner was Michael Calleri, a collector from the Buffalo area, who was awarded a \$1,600 paperweight donated by David Graeber. The floral weight, "Autumn in Chicago", is number one in a planned limited series of twenty.

## "The Art of Collecting" - New Release by Art Elder

Texas paperweight collector, Art Elder, recently released a second paperweight book, "*The Art of Collecting*" on October 1, 2010. The book discusses collecting with an organized approach and a focus on collecting as an art form. Art attended a book signing in Chicago for its release at the L.H. Selman paperweight weekend. Proceeds from this book and Art's previous book, "A Passionate Affair", will be donated to the IPS Foundation's Jokelson Scholarship Fund. Through an internet search and review of our website, the Program Coordinator for CACA has invited a presentation from PCA Ontario. CACA, a club with a 36-year history, meets in West Toronto and whose members have wide-ranging interests. Their November speaker was Peter Kaelgren, Professor Emeritus, from the European Department of the Royal Ontario Museum who spoke about ROM acquisitions since 1972. Among those acquisitions were antique paperweights from the Alice B. Hall collection in 1981 and contemporary paperweights from the J.A. Howson Brocklebank collection in 1983. 
