# 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Brocklebank Paperweight Lecture, ROM

On April 23<sup>rd</sup>, the Royal Ontario Museum hosted their sixth annual Brocklebank Paperweight Lecture featuring Arizona glass artist Gordon Smith. A number of our members attended along with members of the ROM. Gordon started his career in 1980 with Kontes Glass and also worked at Wheaton Village. Many of our members have had the opportunity to speak with Gordon at various paperweight events over the years. Gordon creates beautifully detailed lampwork designs. Thank you to our members for supporting the ROM program. It is an event we look forward to and we appreciate the efforts of Conrad Biernacki and Brian Musselwhite of the ROM for their efforts in inviting contemporary artists and hosting the hands-on event each year. We are looking forward to viewing the ROM's paperweight collection once their extensive renovations are complete.

#### Sandra Ainsley Gallery Event

The Sandra Ainsley Gallery in Toronto's Distillery District played host to artists Paul Stankard and Jon Kuhn. Each gave a brief talk followed by a reception and there were many attendees viewing their recent work. Paul mentioned during his talk that he is hoping to soon publish a book. A number of Paul's crystal orbs were sold on the opening day but you still may be able to view some of his extremely delicate botanicals at her gallery. Jon's fused glass cubes were beautifully displayed and a number of pieces were sold to both corporate and private collections. One of Jon's cubes held an exquisite Stankard bouquet orb inside. The Sandra Ainsley Gallery is located at 55 Mill Street, Building 32 in the Distillery District. The gallery is open Monday-Friday 9:30-6:00, Saturday 10:00-6:00, and on Sunday 12:00-6:00, or by appointment. ### Paperweight Fest 2006

Well, it was quite an event. The Delaware Valley Paperweight Collectors Association and Wheaton Village worked for over a year to prepare for this more than four day event. Attendees came from 28 states and Germany, Canada, England and Scotland. Paperweight Fest planners did an excellent job.

Wheaton Village, soon to be renamed the Wheaton Arts and Cultural Center, is home to the Museum of American Glass which houses 6,500 pieces of glass displaying the history of American glassmaking. The collection includes more than 300 paperweights, Victorian art glass, uranium glass and free-blown glass whimsies. The earliest piece dates from 1739 from the Wistarburgh Glass Works, the first successful American glass factory. Also on display are pieces from the glass factories of Mt. Washington, Pairpoint, Durand and Tiffany.

In addition to the permanent displays in the Museum was added the 1714-piece personal collection of William Gaskill, President of the PCA, Inc., who passed away suddenly in October 2005. His large collection included 800 English green bottle glass weights, American folk art frit weights, New England fruit weights, Chinese weights and so many others. William's collection was arranged just as he had kept it, and it will remain at Wheaton on display there until the end of the year.

Our own Jamie McDougall who comes from a family of glass-makers from Wallaceburg, Ontario known as Canada's Glasstown, gave a presentation "Canadian Folk Art Weights". These weights resemble those made in the mid-American states (Ohio, Indiana) and some of the South Jersey type weights. The Wallaceburg factory operated from 1895 until 1999 before closing down.

There were numerous other presentations to attend, lunch and learn sessions with the artists, "The Fires Burn On: 200 Years of Glassmaking in Millville, New Jersey" as well as artist exhibits, dealer fairs and nearly continuous demonstrations at the furnace by Wheaton Village glassmakers and guest artists. A crimp rose made by Don Friel was auctioned off to support educational programs at Wheaton. A Wheaton Village 2006 logo cane was produced by Loren Stump.

Peter McDougall joined fellow Scots, John and son Craig Deacons, at the furnace on a collaborative effort. This collaboration was the first time in nearly thirty years that masters Peter and John have worked together. It was amazing to watch them at their craft. Auction proceeds of their finished products were donated to benefit Wheaton programs.

There were sessions dedicated to the making of twists, of murrine, on antique Baccarat flowers, Pairpoint glass, Victorian 'wiggly' weights, lampworking techniques, glass marbles, and whimseys. It was a delight to enjoy the wealth of knowledge with collectors having the same passion.

We visited numerous dealer booths (but not as many as normally attend the bi-annual PCA Convention) and it was nice to see Virginia and Tony Toccalino with a booth this time. John Gooderham was there and he handed over his prototypes of the Ontario PCA Trillium pins for us to bring home. Jamie and his family attended for the first time and they were heading to Corning on their way back. Darlene Hicks (our honorary Canadian member) attended too. Rick and I had the pleasure of stopping off in a suburb of Philadelphia to visit the home of Andrew and Nancy Scott of the Delaware Valley group for an evening dinner and conversation over the events of the week and to view their paperweights, and collection of art glass and ceramics. I flew on to San Francisco from Philadelphia while Rick drove back to Toronto and faced the customs officials on his own.

#### **Canadian Clay and Glass Gallery**

Josh Simpson recently visited the Canadian Clay and Glass Gallery (CCGG) in Waterloo, Ontario to deliver a presentation and to open his exhibit "Visions of Our Galaxy". Josh's exhibit will be on display from June 4<sup>th</sup> to September 3<sup>rd</sup>. The exhibit will then be moving from the CCGG to the Steninge Palace in Marsta, Sweden from May 5-September 23, 2007.

Also on display at the CCGG from June 4<sup>th</sup> to September 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2006 is the Sherman Foundation Gift, a personal collection of antique and contemporary paperweights from the Lewis Sherman collection. The CCGG summer hours are Tuesday to Saturday, 10:00-5:00, Sunday 1:00-5:00, closed on Monday. Coming in September to the CCGG . . . *Death, Sex & God*, a retrospective of the work of Paul Stankard, will open Sunday, September 10<sup>th</sup> from 1:00-5:00 p.m, featuring a presentation by Paul from 1:00-2:00 p.m. "With a deep connection to nature that is clearly evident in his work, Stankard has been described by some as the world's leading paperweight artist." "Mutatione Mirabili" will exhibit works by artists who explore spiritual themes, including Cara Driscoll, Louise Pentz, Steve Smith, Leigh Smith and Santee Smith. "Laughing Owl the Way" will feature the joyous, irreverent works of Maija Peeples-Bright, one of the founding artists of the California "Funk" movement. Exhibitions will continue until January 7, 2007.



#### **Glass Firm's Future Made Clearer**

Selkirk Glass has been given a stay of execution by the administrators of its parent and sister companies. Both Edinburgh Crystal and Caithness Glass have gone into administration with the loss of almost 300 jobs. Fears were growing that Selkirk Glass would suffer a similar fate as a buyer is sought for the two other companies. Lib Dem MSP Jeremy Purvis met with administrators Deloitte and was assured that the Borders company would continue trading as normal. About 20 workers are employed at Selkirk Glass.
